 - Students from division 5 and 15 shared drumming to the Tsliel-Waututh, Chief Dan George Song
 - Hopefully the turtle Kwii Hamilton and Charisma made from bottle caps collected by Jamieson students will be on display at Vancouver Aquarium
- Earthquake drill on Thursday, May 7th
 - Parents of Kindergarten, grade 1 and grade 2 will collect their kids if they are able to

Treasurer's Report: Stephen Au

- strong financial position
 - \$39,000 in revenue, \$37,000 from hot lunch, rest from concession
- Biggest expense is hot lunch \$12,000
- Ran a surplus of \$24,000, about \$46,000 in cash and \$25,000 in GIC
- Gaming grant has \$2,200
- Scholarships to Hamber and Churchill \$500 to each school
- Cash \$46,000, GIC \$25,000, gaming grant \$2,200, try to spend gaming before end of the year

New Business

- PAC volunteers needed: secretary and hot lunch lead
 - Still don't have secretary for next year, need chair, secretary and treasure to function
- Hot Lunch volunteers needed. Reduce number of hot lunch days?
 - We need hot lunch lead for Wednesday for next school year
 - Parents are getting mandated back to office, maybe only 2 days of hot lunch, Monday and Friday
 - Sometimes there's no volunteers at all, luckily sometimes people sign up last minute

- Most parents don't know, maybe get kids to make posters to advertise need for hot lunch volunteer
- We need at least 1 more parent to lead Wednesday but also additional parents for general volunteer
- Talent show April 14th, 2026
 - 15 groups performing, 42 performers total
 - Tickets sales \$982, concession \$449
- Carnival on May 20th
 - Need parent volunteer for 2:30 - 3:30 until high school kids get there
- Yearbook
 - Deadline is May 15th
 - Upload link for photos in WhatsApp division group
 - Photos of school event only

- Maggie: every time for talent show, a stage is used. Maybe buy a fold away stage, its around \$20,000
 - Cathy: The stage is free to use provided by VSB. We book it and VSB come in, put the stage up and collect it after we are done.
